I would like to congratulate Mr Shannon Farrugia with his success in being awarded a National Excellence in Teaching Award (NEITA).



This special award begins with a written recommendation from the P&C, who put forward five Albion Park High school staff who they considered exemplary. These awards come from over the whole of Australia and celebrate quality teaching and teachers who make a significant impact on young people. This year there were

one thousand four hundred and fifty nominations and Mr Farrugia was one of only sixty to be chosen!. He is the only teacher in the whole of the Illawarra to be awarded. This is a most prestigious national award and we are utterly thrilled to see such a dedicated staff member go so far.

The next step in this process is that only twelve teachers from across Australia are awarded in March next year. Drawn from across Australia, these twelve will receive a professional development grant and one recipient will also have the opportunity to go to Space Camp in Alabama alongside top teachers from each US state. On Friday 20 October, seventy students and four teachers went to Canberra to visit both the Australian War Memorial and Parliament House. Students from the Year 9 Law & Order elective and Year 11 Legal Studies class got to have afternoon tea with our local MP Stephen Jones and discussed some current issues facing our local area.

All Year 9 students have been learning about the impact and experiences of both World War 1 & 2 on Australian soldiers, civilians and society in their HSIE lessons.
