Home Economics

Our Technology students are well immersed in their projects. In year 7 and the Ultimate Space unit the students develop and strengthen their textile and technology skills by creating a cushion that meets the desired needs of a selected client.

Students follow the design process to support and extend their creativity and critical thinking skills by planning, designing and producing a bedroom design and floor plan using web tools such as PBTeen and Room sketcher.

Continuous experimentation occurs throughout the unit, helping students develop creative textile skills in sewing, hand-stitching, applique and dying techniques.

Students then demonstrate the design process by constructing a cushion using various textile techniques that match their designed room.



Within the year 8 Food Foundations technology unit, students develop and extend both their food knowledge and practical skills by designing and producing a pizza.



Students are required to modify an unhealthy recipe and produce a healthier alternative. By utilising the design process, students are required to think critically and creatively to develop a pizza that best suits the given design brief and situation. Students demonstrate their practical skills acquired throughout the unit within the practical assessment, with a focus on food presentation and visual appeal. Year 9 Food Technology have been immersed in their 'Food for Special Occasions' assessment where they had to plan for a child's birthday party. They busily created an invitation

and menu for their party as well a birthday cake for the party! Every student put a lot of effort into this task and they all learnt a lot through the process. Some of the cakes these students created are pictured below.

Year 8/9 Agriculture Workshop

On Sunday 9 September, nine students from Albion Park High School were invited to attend the country kickback workshop which was held at the Albion Park Showground. This was an amazing, educational learning experience.



We learned a number of new things about how to judge animals and produce and had a lot of fun at the

same time. We learned what to look for when judging a horse, cow, chicken, sheep, dogs and tomatoes. I now know that when a tomato is being judged for competition you need to feel, if it is squishy and if it has any holes or if it is turning another colour.

It was a great experience and I highly recommend it to anyone who is interested in judging at competitions or

shows in the future. It was also a very popular event providing yummy food and engaging activities.
