Year 8 Writing Workshops

Today we commenced the roll out of a series of writing workshops to our Year 8 students.

Students gained an understanding of the elements which make up a piece of writing as well as how these elements are assessed in the NAPLAN test and by their own teachers. Students were given the opportunity to reflect upon their own writing and identify their own strengths and areas they need to improve upon. With the introduction of the Literacy Progressions across the Nation over the next few years, teachers across all years and subjects will be involved in reflecting upon where students are on the Literacy Progressions and implementing ways they can build student literacy levels to the next level of the Literacy Progressions.



We at Albion Park High School are ahead of the game, having recently completed the task of identifying each Year 7 and 8 student on the Literacy Progressions. The Year 8 writing workshop is the first of a series of workshops



which will provide students with an opportunity to reflect upon themselves as learners and identify areas which will allow them to develop their literacy skills.

The Tell Them From Me Student feedback survey (Term 3, 2018)



I am delighted that this term, our school, like many other public schools in the state, will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the Tell Them From Me student feedback survey.

The survey measures factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other student outcomes. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices.

You may remember that our students also participated in a Tell Them From Me student survey in Term 1 this year. Asking students to complete the survey twice in one year allows us to identify trends in student responses as well as track engagement and motivation across the school year.

The survey is a great opportunity for our students to provide us with valuable and quick feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. Schools in Australia and around the world have used the Tell Them From Me survey to help improve how they do things at school.

This Term, our school will be participating in the Partners in Learning parent survey, another part of the Tell Them From Me suite of surveys (student, teacher and parent surveys) on student engagement. The survey asks parents and carers questions about different factors that are known to impact on student wellbeing and engagement.

Running this survey will help our school understand parents' and carers' perspectives on their child's experience at school. These include: communication between parents/carers and staff, activities and practices at home and parent/carer views on the school's support of learning and behaviour.

This valuable feedback will help our school make practical improvements.

The survey is conducted entirely online on smartphones, ipads, tablets, laptops or computers. The survey will typically take 15 minutes or less to complete and is completely confidential. The parent survey can be conducted anytime between the 27 August and 26 October, 2018. Although participating in the survey is entirely voluntary, your responses are very much appreciated.
