Support also went this month to WHITE RIBBON, a growing movement raising awareness of the dreadful statistic on violence against women in Australia. Did you know that

- 1. On average, one woman a week is murdered by her current or former partner.
- 2. 1 in 4 women have experienced emotional abuse by a current or former partner since the age of 15.
- 3. 1 in 5 women have experienced sexual violence since the age of 15.
- 4. 85% of Australian women have been sexually harassed.
- 5. Almost 40% of women continued to experience violence from their partner while temporarily separated.
- 6. 1 in 6 women have experienced stalking since the age of 15.

These statistics are shocking and will only be changed with continued concern, care and education from the community. That is why I was so proud of our Year 12 boys, along with Chloe Clifford and Mr Todd Wilcoxon, when I witnessed their simple, but emotive message, of writing one word on each student's hand as a symbol of hope, to show that every person is responsible to do something about saying 'no more'.
