Our junior years have been learning all about history. Our Year 7 classes have completed their 'History Mystery' task — exploring an event or person from the past that is controversial. Additionally, our HUB Pilot classes successfully performed their re-enactment of an ancient Greek or Chinese myth to an audience of parents and staff members.



Special mention to Jordan Fletcher's efforts in creating special masks for the good and evil characters in the myth 'Androcles and the Lion' (pictured).



Congratulations to Liam Jenkins and Ashlee Drinkwater for their excellent biography of Chinese Emperor, Qin Shi Huang. Also, well done to Emily Hudson and Charlotte Bush for their costuming and delivery of their play 'Theseus and the Minotaur.'

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Year 8 has been exploring Medieval Europe – life, weapons, beliefs and social structures. Students have worked well on the creation of an historically accurate artefact or scale replica.

A special mention to Hayley Whitchurch of 8HGI for the creation of a scale model castle made from over 2000 paddle-pop sticks. The castle features towers, a ladder to the top of the towers, an operating drawbridge over a moat, and has flags and knights too. An awesome effort.



Year 9 has been learning about the Industrial Revolution. The major task this term has been an extended writing task focusing upon using evidence to support a fact or statement. Students from 9HG1 to 9HG5 have made large gains in their writing through the task.

The Skills 21 class with Mr Mick Reynolds has produced some excellent pieces of writing, demonstrating a high degree of attention to detail and commitment. They have deconstructed sample responses and utilised feedback effectively to improve their responses.

Special mention to Jack Jeffs and Taylah Bright (pictured with Mr Reynolds) for their efforts! Well done.



Year 10 has been focused upon understanding the Holocaust this term. A recent excursion to the Jewish Museum in Sydney was an enlightening and powerful experience for students and staff alike. Here they saw primary evidence and heard directly from a survivor, Paul Drexler, as he told his story. The students asked very good questions and were exceptionally attentive.



Also, over the term, students have been working on producing a book on the Holocaust – fiction or nonfiction – that is pitched to a younger audience. The challenge was to adapt information and images to cater for children of 11-12 years old, as well as present some confronting historical facts. Last week, 160 students from Mt Terry Public and Tullimbar Public read these books in student-led sessions.

What a great term of history.


