Principal's Message

All parents will be quite aware of the coronavirus and the implications for the spread in schools. I am writing the newsletter with this focus to present some basic facts and to inform parents of the measures that we are taking at Albion Park High school.

- At this time Monday 16 March, all students should be at school see details below.
- Each day the department is updating all schools with multiple emails outlining any changes, hour by hour.
- All excursions have been cancelled

All professional development for staff has been cancelled.

- Everyone in a school setting is to apply the 1-metre rule where you do not touch another person so as to limit any possible infection.
- All soap dispensers have been checked for soap availability and more dispensers are being sourced along with sanitizer. Please remind your child that drying their hands is as important as washing them.
- Students have been reminded about washing their hands at every opportunity, but especially before and after eating. This message needs to be reinforced at home.
- Students have been given extra opportunities to wash their hands in school hours, especially in hospitality kitchens, science, art and TAS, where water is readily available.

School response to COVID 19 – important update

Currently our school is open and operational. The only **justified reasons** for students to be absent from school are:

- 1. Students are sick/unwell or health compromised.
- Students have recently returned from overseas travel including transit through high risk countries and are required to selfisolate as per NSW Health isolation protocols.
- Student is confirmed close contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 and is required to isolate to comply with NSW Health isolation protocols

4. Student tests positive for COVID-19 or tests positive for COVID-19 during quarantine period.

Parents who choose to keep students at home for reasons other than those mentioned above will be recorded as un-justified leave.

As a school we are doing our best to support good hygiene and health practices. This includes:

- Encouraging staff and students who are unwell, especially those with cold or flu symptoms to remain at home until all symptoms resolve and where appropriate seek advice from a medical practitioner.
- Actively promoting and providing facilities and time for good hand sanitation practices, including the regular checking of soap dispensers and hand towel facilities.
- We are promoting good cough and sneeze etiquette to our student body.
- Actively participating in the phased social distancing strategy as set out by the Department of Education. This includes looking at alternatives to large gatherings of students where possible, cancellation or postponement of excursions outside our school community, including arts and sporting activities and events.

Albion Park High School has access to online teaching and learning platforms to ensure that staff/student communication can continue in the event that students cannot access face to face teaching. The following platforms are used by faculties;
